About TeenWork

When you take initiative and work hard, you'll succeed. This year, 37 students participated in KUB's TeenWork program and took it as a chance to learn and grow.

KUB's TeenWork program was created 29 years ago by a former KUB Commissioner, Clifford H. Ross, giving juniors at Austin-East Magnet High School the opportunity to gain fundamental skills to succeed in any workplace. TeenWorkers not only gain skills, but they learn to apply what they learned from the program sessions and field trips throughout their paid summer internship. In 2021, KUB started to work with two additional high schools, giving students at Central and Fulton High Schools the opportunity to be a part of KUB's TeenWork program. This year, KUB added another school to the list, opening the opportunity to juniors at South Doyle High School.

Students are required to have at least a 2.5 GPA or higher, teacher recommendation, and complete the application and interview process to be accepted into the TeenWork program. TeenWorkers participated in monthly classes and learned about a variety of topics including resume writing, interviewing skills, goal setting, time management, and team building. These classes allowed students to grow in their personal and professional career.

After completing all the program sessions, TeenWork students have the opportunity to participate in a paid summer internship. After a multi-stage interview process, students were matched with mentors who aligned with their goals. Students worked alongside their mentors during the summer.

This program allows students to work and explore career fields that may interest them. KUB's TeenWork program sets students up for success by providing skills that allow teens to have a brighter future after high school.




In what areas did you grow or learn more about during your time at KUB? I learned more about how to have a good resume and how to dress professionally for job interviews and for work.


How has partnering with KUB's TeenWork program helped your business?

We try and give our TeenWorkers a variety of experiences each summer. That can include having them shadow the many departments within the Chamber, arranging off-site field trips, and more.
















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
