Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure for Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

**(South Knoxville) Cherokee Trail Area Intermittent Lane Closures [November 15-30]**– Beginning Tuesday, November 15, and lasting through Wednesday, November 30, KUB crews will implement intermittent lane closures on the following streets near Cherokee Trail in order to perform work on the water distribution system in the area:

- **Edington Road** (between Cherokee Trail and Avenue A)
- **Avenue A** (between Edington Road and Cleage Street)
- **Cleage Street** (between Avenue A and Avenue C)
- **Avenue C** (from Avenue A to the road's eastern end)
- **Ingersoll Avenue** (from W Martin Mill Pike to the road's western end)
- **W Martin Mill Pike** (from Ingersoll Avenue to W Young High Pike)
- **W Young High Pike** (from W Martin Mill Pike to Chapman Highway)

Work will occur 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. daily, Monday- Friday, and lane closures will not occur on every street listed above at the same time. Crews will move from location to location as work progresses. All lanes will reopen to traffic outside of listed work hours and on weekends. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control, and local traffic access to driveways will be maintained.

**(Downtown Knoxville) Union Avenue Road Closure [November 15]** – KUB crews will close a section of Union Avenue between Walnut Street and Market Street from 7:30 a.m.- 3:30 p.m., on Tuesday, November 15, as work is performed on the natural gas distribution system in the area. Access to businesses in the area will be maintained, and flagmen will be on site to assist with traffic control. Alternate routes include Walnut Street, W. Summit Hill Drive, and S. Gay Street.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
