Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather

permitting]

(West Haven) Ball Camp Pike Road Closure [July 6 – August 15] – KUB contract crews will implement a closure of Ball Camp Pike between Bradshaw Road and Kingsmore Drive continuously from 7 a.m., Monday, July 6, through – 5 p.m., Saturday, August 15, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Alternate routes include Western Avenue and Ball Camp Pike. Local traffic access will be maintained.

(Old North Knoxville) N. Broadway Lane Closure [July 6] – KUB crews will implement a closure of a short section of the northbound, curbside lane of N. Broadway between Cecil Avenue and McCroskey Avenue from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Monday, July 6, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. One northbound lane, the center turn lane, and both southbound lanes will remain open during this time. Access to area businesses will be maintained, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control. Tuesday, July 7, will be used as a rain date if necessary.

(Bearden) Kingston Pike Shifting Lane Closures [Nightly, July 6-10] – KUB contract crews will implement shifting lane closures of Kingston Pike between Homberg Drive and Westwood Road nightly from 6 p.m. – 6 a.m. starting Monday, July 6, through Friday, July 10, for roadway restoration work. The closed lane will vary as work progresses, and all lanes will reopen each morning. Traffic flow though the work zone along with local business access will be maintained.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
