Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(North Knoxville) Lane Closure – Cedar Lane [November 22] – KUB crews will reduce a short section of Cedar Lane to one alternating lane of traffic between Lynndell Road and Montrose Road from 6 a.m. – 4 p.m., Sunday, November 22, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. The westbound lane will be closed while the eastbound lane remains open to alternate traffic through the work zone. Flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control, and access to area driveways will be maintained. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(East Knox) East Sunset Road and Holston Drive [November 23 & 23] KUB contract crews will implement the below traffic control measures as indicated as work continues on the wastewater collection system in the area:

- Monday, November 23 – Intersection of East Sunset Road and S. Chilhowee Drive closed 7 a.m. – noon. Alternate routes include E. Sunset Road, Inglewood Drive, and Skyline Drive.
- Tuesday, November 24 – Holston Drive closed between S. Chilhowee Drive and Asheville Highway from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. S. Chilhowee Drive and Asheville Highway should be used as alternate routes.

Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
