Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(Fort Sanders Area) Clinch Avenue and James Agee Street [Extended, December 21-23] – KUB contract crews will implement the below traffic control measures daily from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday, December 21, through Wednesday, December 23, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area:

- Clinch Avenue closed between Sixteenth Street and James Agee Street (parking access maintained to The Knox and Volunteer Hall)
- James Agee Street closed between White Avenue and Clinch Avenue
- The intersection of Clinch Avenue and James Agee Street will also be closed

Alternate routes include Sixteenth Street, Laurel Avenue, White Avenue, Cumberland Avenue, Fourteenth Street, and Bridge Avenue. There will be periodic sidewalk closures in the work zone as needed, but access to area buildings and associated parking will be maintained. When safe to do so, one lane of traffic may be reopened in the work zone for through traffic. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
