- Re: Traffic Advisory Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(Downtown Knoxville) Clinch Avenue Lane Closure [June 26] – KUB crews will reduce a short section of Clinch Avenue between Locust Street and Walnut Street to one alternating lane of traffic from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Wednesday, June 26, as work is performed on the natural gas distribution system in the area. The westbound lane will be closed while the eastbound lane remains open to alternate traffic through the work zone. The adjacent sidewalk on the north side of the road will also be closed during this time

(Westmoreland Heights) Kingston Pike Lane Closure [Overnight, June 26-27] – KUB crews will implement a lane closure of the westbound, curbside lane on a short section of Kingston Pike between Major Reynolds Place and Westfield Road overnight from 9 p.m., Wednesday, June 26, through 6 a.m., Thursday, June 27, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. One westbound lane, the center turn lane, and both eastbound lanes will remain open. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control.

(North Knoxville) N. Broadway Lane Closures [Overnight, June 27-28] – KUB crews will close a short section of both the northbound and southbound inside lanes, and the center turn lane, of N. Broadway between Buchanan Avenue and Mineral Springs Avenue overnight from 9 p.m., Thursday, June 27, through 6 a.m., Friday, June 29, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. The outside northbound and southbound lanes will remain open to traffic. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
