Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(Northwest Knoxville) Clinton Highway Overnight Lane Closure [December 13-14]

– KUB crews will close the northbound and southbound curbside lanes on a short section of Clinton Highway between Allen Drive and Tillery Road from 10 p.m., Thursday, December 13, through 6 a.m., Friday, December 14, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. One northbound and one southbound lane and all turn lanes will remain open. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(UT Area) Neyland Drive Intermittent Lane Closures [December 14]

– KUB contract crews will implement intermittent lane closures as needed of Neyland Drive between Joan Cronan Way and the UT Gardens from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Friday, December 14, as preparation work is performed ahead of water work in the area. Traffic flow in both directions will be maintained. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
