Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather

permitting]

(North Knoxville) Clinton Highway Lane Closure [December 11] – KUB crews will close a short section of southbound, curbside lane of Clinton Highway between Allen Drive and Tillery Road from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. Tuesday, December 11, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Both northbound lanes and one southbound lane will remain open at this time. Access to area business will be maintained. Appropriate signage and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(North Knoxville) Colonial Circle Road Closure [December 11] – KUB crews will close a section of Colonial Circle between Peyton Place and N. Broadway to traffic from 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. on Tuesday, December 11, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Alternate routes include Pruden Drive, Gresham Road and Ridgewood Road. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(South Knoxville) Island Home Avenue Road Closure [December 11] – KUB crews will close a section of Island Home Avenue between Burnett Creek Road and Glenda Lane to traffic from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. on Tuesday, December 11, as work is performed on the electric distribution system in the area. Alternate routes include Sevierville Pike, Burnette Creek Road and Prospect Road. Access to area homes will be maintained, and flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
