Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

**(Farragut) Everett Road Lane Closures [Weekdays, June 24-August 9]** – KUB contract crews will implement lane closures as needed on Everett Road between Yellow Glen Boulevard and Split Rail Lane weekdays between 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., starting Monday, June 24, through Friday, August 9, as work is performed on the natural gas system in the area. The closed lane will vary as work progresses, and traffic flow in both directions will be maintained at all times. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

**(Wooded Acres) Road Closure - Woods-Smith Road [June 23]** – KUB crews will close a short section of Woods-Smith Road between John May Drive and Barnard Road from 6 a.m. - 4 p.m., on Sunday, June 23, as work is performed on both the water distribution and wastewater collection systems in this area. Alternate routes include John May Road, Wooded Acres Drive, Outer Drive, Woodbark Trace, and Barnard Road. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

**(Marble City Area) Road Closure – Painter Avenue [Extended through June 28]** – KUB contract crews will maintain a closure of Painter Avenue at Concord Street, between Safety City Road and Sullins Street, to through traffic weekdays from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., through Friday, June 28, for roadway restoration following wastewater collection system work in the area. Due to extensive excavation, the Painter Avenue intersection at Concord Street will remain closed for the duration of this work. There will be intermittent lane shifts as needed by work crews on Concord Street only during work hours. Alternate routes include Jersey Avenue, Sullins Street, and Safety City Road. Local traffic access will be maintained. Appropriate signage, flaggers, and barricades will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

**(Sequoyah Hills) Sequoyah Hills Area Traffic Impacts [June 24 - 28]** – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated traffic control measures during work hours, 7 a.m.- 5 p.m., Monday-Friday, June 24 - 28, as work continues on the wastewater collection system project in the area:

- Daily lane closures during work hours:
  - Cherokee Boulevard between Kenesaw Avenue and Southgate Road
- Intermittent road closures as needed during work hours:
  - Cedarhill Road between Scenic Drive and Whitlow Avenue
  - Bluff View Road between Scenic Drive and Holloway Drive
  - Holloway Drive between Cedarhill Road and Bluff View Road
  - Kenesaw Avenue between Iskagna Drive and Woodland Drive

- Intermittent road closures as needed for concrete restoration. Please notes some of these sections may be closed for up to 24 hours to allow the concrete to set:
  - Iskagna Drive between E. Nokomis Circle and Kenesaw Avenue
  - Windgate Street between Iskagna Drive and Oakhurst Drive
  - Talahi Avenue between Kennesaw Avenue and Keowee Avenue
  - Kenesaw Ave between Iskagna Drive and Talahi Avenue (this will only be a lane closure due to the location of the patch being on one side of the road)

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
