Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

(North Knoxville) Heiskell Avenue Lane Closure [February 3-7] – KUB contract crews will implement lane closures of a short section of Heiskell Avenue between the northbound I-275 exit ramps and N. Central Street nightly from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m., February 3-7, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Access to local businesses will be maintained, as will traffic in both directions. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(North Knoxville) N. Central Street Lane Closures [February 3-14] – KUB contract crews will implement lane closures of a short section of N. Central Street between Heiskell Avenue and Coram Street nightly from 6 p.m. – 6 a.m., February 3-14, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Work will not take place on Friday and Saturday. Access to local businesses will be maintained, as will traffic in both directions. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(Sequoyah Hills) Arrowhead Trail Intermittent Road Closure [February 4-8] – KUB contract crews will intermittently close Arrowhead Trail between Lyons View Pike and Blows Ferry Road to through traffic from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., from February 4-8, as work is performed on the wastewater collection systems in the area. Access to driveways will be maintained, and the road will reopen to normal traffic flow when construction crews are not present. Appropriate signage and barricades will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Sequoyah Hills) Towanda Trail Intermittent Road Closure [February 4-8] – KUB contract crews will intermittently close a short section of Towanda Trail between Kingston Pike and Shawnee Lane to through traffic from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., from February 4-8, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Access to driveways will be maintained, and the road will reopen to normal traffic flow when construction crews are not present. Appropriate signage and barricades will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
