Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather

permitting]

(Downtown Knoxville) Henley Street/W Church Avenue/Walnut Street Lane Closures [Overnight, August 23-24] – KUB crews will intermittently close the inside north- and southbound lanes on the section of Henley Street between W Summit Hill Drive and W Church Avenue overnight from staring at 9 p.m., Tuesday, August 23, through 5 a.m., Wednesday, August 24, as work is performed on the underground electric system in the area. Remaining north- and southbound lanes, will remain open on this section of Henley Street while this work is performed. Additionally, crews will implement intermittent closures of the eastbound lane of W Church Street between Locust Street and Walnut Street, and the west side northbound lane of Walnut Street between Clinch Avenue and Cumberland Avenue.

Appropriate signage and flaggers will be on site at both locations to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
