Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

**(Sequoyah Hills Area) Kingston Pike Lane Closure [March 13-14]** – KUB contract crews will close of a short section of the eastbound, inside lane of Kingston Pike from Lyons View Pike to Kingston Park Drive, daily from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Wednesday, March 13, and Thursday, March 14, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. One eastbound and both westbound lanes will remain open. Access to area businesses and driveways will be maintained. Appropriate signage and barricades will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

**(Halls Crossroads) Brown Gap Road Closure [Extended, March 13-14]** – KUB crews will close a short section of Brown Gap Road between Carter Road and Cedarchase Boulevard to through traffic from 8:30 a.m.- 1:30 p.m., on Wednesday, March 13, and Thursday, March 14, as work is performed on the electric distribution systems in the area. Carter Road through traffic will not be able to turn left onto Brown Gap Road, but local traffic access will be maintained. Alternate routes include Tazewell Pike, Carter Road, Brown Gap Road, and Crippen Road. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
