(East Knoxville) East Magnolia Avenue Lane Closures [Overnight, September 7-8] – KUB crews will close a short section of both curbside lanes (eastbound and

– KUB crews will close a short section of both curbside lanes (eastbound and westbound) on East Magnolia Avenue near the Jessamine Avenue intersection from 9 p.m., Thursday, September 7, though 6 a.m., Friday, September 8, as work is completed on the electric distribution system in the area. One eastbound lane, the center turn lane, and one westbound lane will remain open during this time frame, as will turn access to Jessamine Avenue. Access to local businesses will be maintained, and flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(West Knoxville) Kingston Pike Lane Closure [September 8] – KUB crews will close a short section of the curbside, eastbound lane of Kingston Pike between Mohican Street and McCoy Street from 4:30 – 7 a.m. on Friday, September 8, as work is performed on the electric distribution system in the area. One eastbound lane, the center turn lane, and both westbound lanes will remain open. Access to local businesses will be maintained, and flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
