Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures are weather

permitting]

(Western Heights) McSpadden Street Lane Closure [July 22] – KUB contract crews will reduce a short section of McSpadden Street to one alternating lane of traffic between Belleaire Avenue and Scott Avenue from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Monday, July 22, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. The southbound lane will be closed while the northbound lane remains open to alternate traffic through the work zone. The adjacent sidewalk will also be closed during this time. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control.

(Sequoyah Hills) Sequoyah Hills Area Traffic Impacts [July 22-26] – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated traffic control measures during work hours, 7 a.m.- 5 p.m., Monday-Friday, July 22-26, as work continues on the wastewater collection system project in the area:

- Daily lane closures during work hours:
 - o Cherokee Boulevard between Southgate Road and Lakeland Drive
 - o Cherokee Boulevard between Lakeland Drive and Scenic Drive
 - Kenesaw Avenue between Cherokee Boulevard and Taliluna Avenue
- Intermittent road closures as needed during work hours:
 - Keowee Avenue between Kenesaw Avenue and Talahi Avenue
 - Kenesaw Avenue between Iskagna Drive and Woodland Drive
 - o Kenesaw Avenue between Woodland Drive and Iskagna Drive

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
