Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

(Fort Sanders) Clinch Avenue Road Closure [November 12] – KUB crews will close a short section of Clinch Avenue between Twelfth Street and Thirteenth Street continuously from 7 a.m. – 3 p.m., Sunday, November 12, as wastewater system work is performed in the area. Alternate routes include Twelfth Street, White Avenue, Laurel Avenue, and Thirteenth Street. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Access to area driveways and parking lots will be maintained.

(West Knoxville) Westland Drive Lane Closure [November 12] – KUB crews will reduce a short section of Westland Drive to one alternating lane of traffic between Kingsford Way and Sherwood Drive (easternmost intersection with Westland Drive) from 7 a.m. – 3 p.m. on Sunday, November 12, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. The westbound lane will be closed, while the eastbound lane remains open and is used to alternate traffic through the work zone. Appropriate signage and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(West Knoxville) Broome Road Lane Closure [November 13 & 14] – KUB crews will reduce a short section of Broome Road to one alternating lane of traffic between Middlebrook Pike and Marlboro Road daily from 8:30 a.m. – 4 p.m., on Monday, November 13, and Tuesday, November 14, as work is performed on both the water distribution and wastewater collection systems in the area. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Access to driveways will be maintained. All lanes will reopen to traffic outside of listed work hours on this section of Broome Road. Wednesday, November 15, will be used as a rain date, if necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
