Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures and work are weather

permitting]

(East Knoxville) Road Closures [Weekdays, October 28 – November 1] – KUB contract crews will implement closures weekdays between 7:30 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. on the below roadways for ongoing wastewater collection system work in the area:

- S. Park Street between Asheville Highway and Holston Drive
- Ivy Street between Ault Street and Jamey Street
- Michael Street between Holston Drive and Norwalk Avenue
- N. Park Road between Asheville Highway and Nash Road
- Meadow View Road between Holston Drive and Ivy Avenue
- Mansion Avenue between Ault Street and Mansion Avenue dead end

All areas will not be impacted at the same time. Local traffic access will be maintained. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(East Knoxville) Asheville Highway Lane Closure [Weekdays, October 28 – November 1] – KUB contract crews will close the eastbound curbside lane of Asheville Highway between Martin Luther King Jr. Avenue and Ault Road as needed weekdays between 7:30 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. for ongoing wastewater collection system work in the area. One eastbound lane, the center turn lane, and both westbound lanes will remain open.

Sequoyah Hills Area Traffic Impacts (October 28–November 1) – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated traffic control measures during work hours, 7 a.m.- 5 p.m., Monday-Friday, October 28– November 1, as work continues on the wastewater collection system project in the area:

- Intermittent road closures as needed during work hours:
 - o Bluff View Road between Southgate Road and Holloway Drive

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
