Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(West Knoxville) Ball Camp Pike Road, Lane Closure [October 21] – KUB crews will close a short section of Ball Camp Pike between Hazelwood Road and Kingsmore Drive from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., on Sunday, October 21, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Alternate routes include Western Avenue, Copper Kettle Street, and Hazelwood Drive. Access to Kingsmore Drive will be maintained. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(West Knoxville) Hollywood Road Lane Closures [October 22-24] – KUB contract crews will implement a series of lane closures on a short section of Hollywood Road between Sutherland Avenue and Papermill Drive daily, from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. starting on Monday October 22 through Wednesday, October 24, as work is performed on the electric distribution system in the area. One alternating lane of traffic will be maintained at all times, and flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(UT Area) Neyland Drive Lane Closure [October 22] – KUB contract crews will reduce a short section of Neyland Drive between Joan Cronan Way and Lake Loudoun Boulevard to one lane of traffic in each direction from 9 a.m. – noon, on Monday, October 22, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. One lane of traffic in each direction and the center turn lane will remain open. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(East Knoxville) Riverside Drive Lane Closure [October 19-20] – KUB crews will close a short section of the eastbound lane of Riverside Drive between Laurans Avenue and Lombard Place from 7 p.m. Friday, October 19, through 7 a.m., Saturday, October 20, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. The eastbound lane will be closed, and the westbound lane will be used to alternate traffic through the area. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Sequoyah Hills Area) Sequoyah Avenue Road Closure [October 22] – KUB crews will close a short section of Sequoyah Avenue between Southgate Road and Beacon Hill Lane from 8 a.m. – 2 p.m. on Monday, October 22, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Alternate

routes include Southgate Road, Lakeland Drive, and Taliluna Avenue. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary. Tuesday, October 23, will be used as a rain date if necessary.

(Sequoyah Hills) Sequoyah Hills Area Road Closures [October 22-26] – KUB contract crews will implement the below road closures as needed daily, Monday-Friday, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., October 22-26, as work continues on the wastewater collection system in the area:

- Hiawatha Drive between Noelton Drive and Towanda Trail
- Noelton Drive between Kingston Pike and Chippewa Circle
- Noelton Drive between Alta Vista Way and Chippewa Circle
- Chippewa Circle between Noelton Drive

Additionally, Chickasaw Road between Cherokee Boulevard and Navaho Road will be closed continuously through Friday, October 26, due to extensive excavation. Access to area homes will be maintained, and flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Unless otherwise indicated, roadways will be re-opened outside of work hours. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
