Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

**(North Knox) N. Broadway Lane Closure [Overnight, April 15-16]** – KUB crews will close a short section of the curbside, northbound lane of N. Broadway between Sanders Drive and Harvest Mill way overnight from 10 p.m., Thursday, April 15, through 6 a.m., Friday, April 16, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. One northbound lane, the center turn lane, and both southbound lanes will remain open. Business access will be maintained, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.

**(South Knox) Chapman Highway Lane Closure [Overnight, April 15-16]** – KUB crews will close a short section of the curbside, southbound lane of Chapman Highway between E. Martin Mill Pike and Lippencott Street overnight from 10 p.m., Thursday, April 15, through 6 a.m., Friday, April 16, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. One southbound lane, the center turn lane, and both northbound lanes will remain open. Flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
