Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather

permitting]

(North Knoxville) N. Central Street & Heiskell Avenue Lane Closures [Daily, June 17-21] – KUB contract crews will implement lane closures on a short section of the below roadways, Monday-Friday, from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area:

- N. Central Street between Heiskell Avenue and E. Morelia Avenue and
- Heiskell Avenue between the I-275 ramps and N. Central Street

The closed lane will vary depending on worksite conditions, however, traffic flow will be maintained at all times. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Sequoyah Hills) Sequoyah Hills Area Traffic Impacts [June 17-21] – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated traffic control measures during work hours, 7 a.m.- 5 p.m., Monday-Friday, June 17-21, as work continues on the wastewater collection system project in the area:

- Daily lane closures during work hours:
  - o Cherokee Boulevard between Kenesaw Avenue and Southgate Road
- Intermittent road closures as needed during work hours:
  - o Cedarhill Road between Scenic Drive and Whitlow Avenue
  - o Bluff View Road between Scenic Drive and Holloway Drive
  - Holloway Drive between Cedarhill Road and Bluff View Road
  - o Kenesaw Avenue between Iskagna Drive and Woodland Drive
- Intermittent road closures as needed for concrete restoration. Please notes some of these sections may be closed for up to 24 hours to allow the concrete to set:
  - o Iskagna Drive between E. Nokomis Circle and Kenesaw Avenue
  - Windgate Street between Iskagna Drive and Oakhurst Drive
  - W. Nokomis Circle between E. Nokomis Circle and Iskagna Drive

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
