Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

**(North Knox) N Broadway Lane Closures (Daily, November 21-23 & Overnight, November 28-December 9)** – KUB contractor crews will implement temporary lane closures along the section of N Broadway between McCroskey Avenue and Kenyon Street during the following periods over the next several weeks as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area:

- **(Prior to Thanksgiving) Daily from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., Monday, November 21, through Wednesday, November 23**
- **(After Thanksgiving) Overnight from 7 p.m. – 6 a.m., Monday, November 28 through Friday, December 9,**

The inside southbound and center turn lanes will be closed on this section of N Broadway. The southbound curbside lane of N Broadway, the southbound Hall of Fame Drive access ramp, and both northbound lanes of N Broadway will remain open. Channeling devices will be present to assist with maintaining local traffic flow. Appropriate signage will be placed around the construction zone to assist with traffic control. Crews will not work over the Thanksgiving holidays, November 24-27.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
