Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are

weather permitting]

(Northwest Knoxville) Pleasant Ridge Road Lane Closures Extended [Daily, February 28-March 3, 2022] – KUB contractor crews will continue to reduce sections of Pleasant Ridge Road to one alternating lane of traffic between Merchant Drive and Schaad Road daily from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. starting on Monday, February 28, and lasting through Thursday, March 3, as work is performed on the overhead electric system in the area. One open lane will be maintained with flaggers present to alternate traffic flow in the immediate area where crews are working. The entire stretch of Pleasant Ridge Road will not be affected at one time. Access to connecting side streets and driveways will be maintained. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(East Knoxville) Parkview Avenue at Martin Luther King Jr Boulevard Lane Closure [Daily, February 28-March 1, 2022] – KUB contractor crews will reduce a section of Parkview Avenue to one alternating lane of traffic at the Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard intersection daily from 7:30 a.m. – 5 p.m. on Monday, February 28, and Tuesday, March 1, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system. One open lane will be maintained with flaggers present to alternate traffic flow in the immediate area where crews are working. Traffic flow will return to normal outside of listed work hours.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
