(West View) Proctor Street Lane Closure [Rescheduled, July 23] – KUB contract crews will reduce a short section of Proctor Street to one alternating lane of traffic between News Sentinel Drive and Middlebrook Pike from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Tuesday, July 23, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. The southbound lane will be closed while the northbound lane remains open to alternate traffic through the work zone. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control.

(Western Heights) Beaumont Avenue Lane Closure [Rescheduled, July 24] – KUB contract crews will reduce a short section of Beaumont Avenue to one alternating lane of traffic between Jordan Street and Toms Street from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Wednesday, July 24, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. The westbound lane will be closed while the eastbound lane remains open to alternate traffic through the work zone. The adjacent sidewalk will also be closed during this time. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
