Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(East Knoxville) Road Closures [Weekdays, November 25-27] – KUB contract crews will implement closures weekdays between 7:30 a.m. – 6 p.m. on the below roadways for ongoing wastewater collection system work in the area:

- Holston Drive between Holston Court and S. Chilhowee Drive
- Ivy Avenue between Ault Street and Meadow View Road

Local traffic access will be maintained. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Downtown) S. Central Street Road Closure [November 24] – KUB crews will close a short section of S. Central Street between Summit Hill Drive and Commerce Avenue to through traffic and parking from 6:30 a.m. – 2 p.m., Sunday, November 24, as work is performed on the water distribution and wastewater collection systems in the area. Alternate routes include State Street, S. Gay Street, Union Avenue, and Commerce Avenue. Flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control, and access to area businesses will be maintained.

Sequoyah Hills Area Traffic Impacts (November 25-27) – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated traffic control measures during work hours, 7 a.m.- 5 p.m., Monday-Friday, November 25-27, as work continues on the wastewater collection system project in the area:

- Intermittent road closures as needed during work hours:
 - Kenesaw Avenue between Taliluna Avenue and Keowee Avenue
 - South Garden Road between Navaho Road and Cherokee Boulevard
 - Woodside Street between Woodland Drive and Iskagna Drive

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
