Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather

permitting]

(Downtown Knoxville) S. Gay Street Parking Sidewalk & Parking Closure [Overnight, August 16-17] – KUB crews will close the northbound curbside parking lane and adjacent east sidewalk on a one block section of S. Gay Street between Wall Avenue and Union Avenue overnight from 9 p.m., Tuesday, August 16, through 5 a.m., Wednesday, August 17, as work is performed on the underground electric system in the area. Both the north- and southbound vehicle traffic lanes will remain open on this section of S. Gay Street.

(Downtown) S Broadway/W Jackson Avenue Intersection Lane Closures (Overnight, August 16-17) – KUB crews will close the northbound righthand turn lane on South Broadway and the westbound righthand turn lane on W Jackson Avenue overnight from 9 p.m., Tuesday, August 16, through 5 a.m., Wednesday, August 17, as work is performed on the electric system in the area. All other lanes at the S Broadway/W Jackson Avenue intersection will remain open. Flaggers will be present to assist with maintaining traffic flow. Access to driveways will be maintained. Appropriate signage will be placed on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued, as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
