Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

Sequoyah Hills Area Traffic Impacts (November 4 – November 8) – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated traffic control measures during work hours, 7 a.m.- 5 p.m., Monday-Friday, November 4 – November 8, as work continues on the wastewater collection system project in the area:

- Intermittent road closures as needed during work hours:
 - Kenesaw Avenue between Taliluna Avenue and Keowee Avenue

(East Knoxville) Road Closures [Weekdays, November 4-15] – KUB contract crews will implement closures weekdays between 7:30 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. on the below roadways for ongoing wastewater collection system work in the area:

- S. Burns Road between Asheville Highway and Holston Drive (November 4-8)
- Michael Street between Holston Drive and Norwalk Avenue (November 4-8)
- Meadow View Road between Holston Drive and Ivy Avenue (November 4-8)
- Mansion Avenue between Ault Street and Mansion Avenue dead end
- Ault Street between Alma Avenue and Mansion Avenue

All areas will not be impacted at the same time. Local traffic access will be maintained. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
