Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(Old Sevier) Sevier Avenue Lane Closure [Weekdays, July 27 – October 30] – KUB contract crews will implement lane closures of Sevier Avenue between Blount Avenue and Davenport Road weekdays from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., starting Monday, July 27, through Friday, October 30, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Traffic flow will be maintained through the work zone, and all areas will not be impacted at one time. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Whittle Springs Area) Lane Closures [Weekdays, July 27 – November 3] – KUB contract crews will implement traffic control measures weekdays (excluding holidays) between 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. on the below roadways for ongoing wastewater collection system work in the area:

- Boright Drive between Whittle Springs Road and Maxwell Street
- McNutt Street between Boright Drive and Forestdale Avenue
- Whitney Place between Boright Drive and Forestdale Avenue
- Brunswick Drive between Boright Drive and Forestdale Avenue

Local traffic access will be maintained, and all areas will not be impacted at one time. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
