Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closures for Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

(Fountain City) Tazewell Pike and Jacksboro Pike Lane Closure [Overnight, March 23-24] – KUB crews will implement the below traffic control measures overnight from 9 p.m., Saturday, March 23, through noon, Sunday, March 24, as work is performed on the electric distribution system in the area:

- Tazewell Pike right hand turn lane closed between McCamey Road and the intersection. Turn access to northbound Tazewell Pike will be maintained.
- Jacksboro Pike northbound lane closed between Tazewell Pike and Rennoc Road. The southbound lane will remain open and be used to alternate traffic through the work zone.

Flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Sequoyah Hills) Sequoyah Avenue Road Closure [March 25-29] – KUB contract crews will close a short section of Sequoyah Avenue between Southgate Road and Aqawela Avenue to through traffic from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., daily, Monday-Friday, starting Monday, March 25, through Friday, March 29, as work continues on the wastewater collection system in the area. Alternate routes include Keowee Avenue and Taliluna Avenue. Access to area homes will be maintained, and barricades and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
