Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures are weather permitting]

(Downtown) W. Hill Avenue Road Closure [Overnight, April 6-7] – KUB crews will close a short section of W. Hill Avenue between S. Gay Street and Walnut Street to traffic overnight from 7 p.m., Saturday, April 6, through 7 a.m., Sunday, April 7, as work is performed on the electric distribution system in the area. Alternate routes in the area include S. Gay Street, Cumberland Avenue, Locust Street, and Main Street. Access to the City County Building Parking Garage will be maintained via S. Gay Street. Flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(Sequoyah Hills) Sequoyah Hills Area Road Closures [April 8-12] – KUB contract crews will implement the below indicated road closures, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., starting Monday, April 8, through Friday, April 12, as work continues on the wastewater collection system in the area:

- Sequoyah Avenue between Lakeland Drive and Southgate Road closed intermittently as needed.
- Kenesaw Avenue between Woodland Drive and Iskagna Drive closed intermittently as needed.
- Taliluna Avenue between Lakeland Drive and Southgate Road closed intermittently as needed.

Taliluna Avenue and Sequoyah Hills will not be closed at the same time. Access to area homes will be maintained, and barricades and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
