Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

**(West Knoxville) Western Avenue Lane Closure [March 29]** – KUB crews will implement a lane closure on the eastbound, curbside lane of Western Avenue between Wilkins Street and Eubanks Avenue, from 8 a.m. - 3 p.m., on Friday, March 29, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. One eastbound lane, the center turn lane, and both westbound lanes will remain open. Access to local businesses will be maintained. Flaggers and signs will be onsite to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

**(Sequoyah Hills Area) Arrowhead Trail Road Closure [March 29]** – KUB contract crews will close Arrowhead Trail between Lyons View Pike and Blows Ferry Road to through traffic from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., Friday, March 29, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Alternate routes include Mellen Avenue, Scenic Drive, and Alta Vista Way. Access to driveways will be maintained. Appropriate signage, barricades, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
