2018 Project Help Campaign

Will Provide Warmth to the Community

Earlier today, Food City and Home Federal Bank presented checks to the Project Help Board totaling \$38,808 for the emergency heating assistance program. The checks represent the amount donated by Food City and Home Federal customers during the 16th annual fundraiser for Project Help. Knoxville-Knox County Community Action Committee (CAC) administers Project Help. Food City, Home Federal Bank, WVLT, WIVK, the Knoxville News Sentinel, and KUB teamed with CAC for the campaign, which ran from January 9 through February 3.

"Project Help continues to provide a positive impact on the local community through these contributions, which help hundreds of families in need each year," said KUB President and CEO Mintha Roach. "We would like to thank all of those involved with the fundraiser."

Project Help is an emergency heating-assistance program that helps pay for electricity, natural gas, propane, heating oil, wood, or coal for people who need temporary help with their heating bills. Project Help clients may have an emergency need because of job loss, illness, injury, or disability, or they may be seniors struggling with the rising cost of living.

Although the Food City campaign is over, we can still help our neighbors stay safe and warm.
